

To accompany the petition of Henry Walton, fire commissioner, and others for legislation relative to the promotion of call firemen to the permanent force in the town of Plymouth. Civil Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

An Act relative to the Promotion of Call Firemen to the Permanent Force in the Town of Plymouth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Members of fire department of
2 the Town of Plymouth, known as call members,
3 who are not over forty years of age and who have
4 served in that department continuously for not
5 less than five years, and who are certified by a
6 physician designated for the purpose by the
7 selectmen to be physically competent for the
8 duty, shall be eligible for appointment by the fire
9 commissioner to the permanent force of the
10 department without further examination.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon
2 acceptance by a majority of the voters of said
3 town present and voting thereon at a town
4 meeting duly called.
