

To accompany the petition of Abbott B. Rice and others that the salary of the clerk in charge of the legislative document room be established. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

An Act to establish the Salary of the Clerk in Charge
of the Legislative Document Room.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter three of the General
2 Laws, as amended in section eighteen by section
3 one of chapter three hundred and sixty-seven of
4 the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-one,
5 and by section one of chapter three hundred and
6 sixty-six of the acts of nineteen hundred and
7 twenty-two, by section one of chapter four hun-
8 dred of the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-
9 three, and by chapter four hundred and one of
10 the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-four,
11 is hereby further amended by striking out said
12 section eighteen and inserting in place thereof
13 the following: —

14 *Section 18.* There shall be a doorkeeper for
15 each branch, each at a salary of twenty-three
16 hundred dollars, and such assistant doorkeepers
17 as it may direct, each at a salary of nineteen hun-

18 dred dollars; a postmaster at a salary of twenty-
19 three hundred dollars; an assistant postmaster;
20 messengers, each at a salary of seventeen hundred
21 dollars; pages whose compensation shall be six
22 hundred and fifty dollars each for the regular
23 annual session and a sum not exceeding three
24 dollars for each day's service after said session;
25 a clerk to take charge of the legislative document
26 room at a salary equal to that paid the clerk in
27 charge of the public document room of the secre-
28 tary of the commonwealth; an assistant clerk of
29 said room at a salary of seventeen hundred dol-
30 lars, and such assistants therein as may be neces-
31 sary, for whose fitness and good conduct the
32 sergeant-at-arms shall be responsible.
