The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

Resolve providing for an Investigation Relative to the Acquisition by the Commonwealth of Certain Land in the Dorchester District of the City of Boston and in the City of Quincy, for Docking and Wharfage Purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That the division of waterways and
2 public lands of the department of public works
3 is hereby authorized and directed to investigate
4 as to the advisability, feasibility and cost of
5 acquiring on the part of the commonwealth by
6 purchase or otherwise, for docking and wharfage
7 purposes, the peninsular situated in the Dorches-
8 ter district of the city of Boston known as Cow
9 pasture, extending eastward from the location
10 of the New York, New Haven and Hartford
11 railroad on the southerly side of Old Harbor;
12 the Neponset river channel extending from the
13 mouth of said river to Milton; and also that tract
14 of land situated in the city of Quincy bordering
15 on Dorchester bay and east of the mouth of said
16 river, known as New Squantum. The division
17 shall report the result of its investigations and
18 its recommendations, with estimates of cost and
19 drafts of any legislation embodying any such

20 recommendations, to the general court by filing
21 the same with the clerk of the house of repre-
22 sentatives not later than October fifteenth in the
23 current year, and shall at the same time file a
24 copy thereof with the budget commissioner.
