Senate, No. 254. Senate Bill No. 106 as passed to be engrossed.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

An Act relative to the Marking of Certain Horse-drawn Vehicles used for Commercial Purposes on Public Ways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter eighty-five of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by inserting after section seven-
3 teen the following new section: —

4 *Section 17A.* Except as otherwise provided,
5 every horse-drawn vehicle while in use for com-
6 mercial purposes on any public way, other than
7 a vehicle in the nature of farm or road machinery
8 or one used for the transportation of hay or grain
9 raised by the owner or user of such vehicle, shall
10 have plainly and conspicuously marked on both
11 sides, in letters not less than one and one half
12 inches high, the name of the owner of said
13 vehicle. Violation of this act shall be punished
14 by a fine of not less than three nor more than one
15 hundred dollars.
