An Act to Change the Title of Attendance Officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section twelve of chapter seventy-seven of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by striking out in
3 the second and sixth lines the words "attendance of-
4 ficers" and substituting therefor the words:—
5 supervisors of attendance,— by striking out in the
6 fourth line the word "officers" and substituting
7 therefor the word:— supervisors,— and by adding
8 after the sixth line the words:— All laws now or
9 hereafter in force relative to attendance officers
10 shall apply to supervisors of attendance,— so this
11 section will read as follows:—

12 *Section 12.* Every school committee shall ap-
13 point and fix the compensation of one or more
14 supervisors of attendance, who may be either male
15 or female, and shall make regulations for their gov-
16 ernment. Such supervisors shall not receive fees
17 for their services. The committees of two or more
18 towns may employ the same supervisors of attend-
19 ance. All laws now or hereafter in force relative
20 to attendance officers shall apply to supervisors of
21 attendance.
