To the Honorable Senate and the House of Representatives.

Under the provisions of section 7 of chapter 3 of the General Laws there is submitted herewith petition of the Boston Medical Library to have additional powers.

This corporation was organized under the provisions of chapter 375 of the Acts of 1874, now chapter 180 of the General Laws. The power to change or add to the purpose of such a corporation may be accomplished under General Laws, chapter 180, section 9, if the corporation at a meeting called for the purpose and by a vote of *all its members* so decides. It requires a unanimous vote of *all its members*. Probably this corporation by reason of scattered membership cannot secure a vote of *all its members* and so requests special legislation.

No fee is required.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Eight.

An Act enlarging the Purposes of the Boston Medical Library.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Boston Medical Library, a corporation established on
2 May seventh, eighteen hundred and seventy-seven, under
3 general law under the name of Boston Medical Library
4 Association, and the title of which was changed to its
5 present title under the provisions of chapter three hun-
6 dred and sixty of the acts of eighteen hundred and
7 ninety-one on May fourth, eighteen hundred and ninety-
8 six, shall have, so far as the same may be additional to
9 its present purposes, the following purposes, to wit:—
10 promoting and advancing medical science and medical
11 education.
