In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Eight.

An Act Prohibiting the Sale of Furs of Animals Killed by Poison.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter one hundred and thirty-one of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
3 section fifty-eight A, inserted by chapter three hun-
4 dred and thirty-four of the acts of nineteen hundred
5 and twenty-five, the following new section:—
6 *Section 58B.* Any hunter, trapper or dealer in furs
7 offering for sale the raw fur of any animal killed
8 by poison, shall be punished by a fine of not less
9 than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dol-
10 lars; provided, that this section shall not apply to
11 the fur of rats, woodchucks or other pests of like
12 nature.
