An Act relative to Appeals from Certain Orders of the
State Fire Marshal.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section five of chapter one hundred and forty-seven
2 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
3 after the word "thereof" in the second line the words:
4 —, except one made by the state fire marshal under
5 section fourteen or forty-five of chapter one hundred
6 and forty-eight, — and by inserting after the word
7 "commissioner" in the sixth line the words: — or by
8 an order made by the state fire marshal as aforesaid,—
9 so as to read as follows:— *Section 5.* Any person
10 affected by an order of the department or of a division
11 or office thereof, except one made by the state fire
12 marshal under section fourteen or forty-five of chapter
13 one hundred and forty-eight, may, within such time
14 as the commissioner may fix, which shall not be less
15 than ten days after notice of such order, appeal to the
16 commissioner, who shall thereupon grant a hearing,
17 and after such hearing may amend, suspend or revoke
18 such order. Any person aggrieved by an order ap-
19 proved by the commissioner, or by an order made by
20 the state fire marshal as aforesaid, may appeal to the
21 superior court; provided, that such appeal is taken

22 within fifteen days from the date when such order is
23 approved. The superior court shall have jurisdiction
24 in equity upon such appeal to annul such order if found
25 to exceed the authority of the department, or upon
26 petition of the commissioner to enforce all valid orders
27 issued by the department. Nothing herein contained
28 shall be construed to deprive any person of the right
29 to pursue any other lawful remedy.
