

HOUSE No. 228

By Mr. Finkelstein of Boston, petition of James M. Curley, mayor, for legislation relative to set-back provisions in connection with the use of buildings and premises and the occupancy of lots in specified districts of the city of Boston. Mercantile Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

An Act relative to the Use of Buildings and Premises, the Height and Bulk of Buildings and the Occupancy of Lots in Specified Districts of the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section sixteen of chapter four hundred
2 dred and eighty-eight of the acts of nineteen hundred
3 dred and twenty-four, as amended by section nine
4 of chapter two hundred and nineteen of the acts of
5 nineteen hundred and twenty-five and section five
6 of chapter two hundred and twenty of the acts of
7 nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, is hereby further
8 amended by adding at the end thereof the
9 following new paragraph: —

10 (14) Wherever a lot abuts on a way other than
11 a street the set-back provisions of this chapter shall
12 apply to such way.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
