## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

An Act to consolidate Town Agencies which have to do with the Planting and Care of Trees.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The selectmen of a town which by  
2 vote at an annual town meeting accepts the provi-  
3 sions of this act, shall forthwith appoint a town  
4 forest committee, as provided under section twenty-  
5 one of chapter forty-five of the General Laws, as  
6 amended by chapter two hundred and twelve of the  
7 acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, pro-  
8 vided the town does not already have a town forest  
9 committee, and all the provisions of that section  
10 shall apply to said committee.

1 SECTION 2. The town forest committee is hereby  
2 charged with the powers and duties conferred and

3 imposed upon the tree warden, and it shall have  
4 the care of all the public shade trees of the town,  
5 and the management of the town forest. Said  
6 committee by vote of the town may also be charged  
7 with the powers and duties of any other elective or  
8 appointive officer or commission having to do with  
9 planting, care and protection of trees on town areas  
10 such as parks, commons, cemeteries and such other  
11 lands as the town may from time to time place  
12 under its control. Any office or commission in the  
13 town so replaced by said committee shall cease to  
14 exist upon the appointment of the town forest com-  
15 mittee.

1 SECTION 3. In the management of the property  
2 under its control said committee is hereby author-  
3 ized to employ a town forester, and such other  
4 assistants as it may deem necessary to properly dis-  
5 charge the powers and duties imposed upon it. No  
6 financial obligation shall be incurred by the com-  
7 mittee until an appropriation therefor has been made  
8 by the town. The committee shall make an annual  
9 report of its work to the town.

1 SECTION 4. To enable town forest committees to  
2 obtain the services of trained foresters, which may  
3 not be feasible acting as separate units, two or more  
4 such committees may form voluntary forestry unions  
5 by which the cost of such services may be shared  
6 by said committees.
