

HOUSE No. 376

By Mr. Garofano of Saugus, petition of J. Fred Manning, Mayor, and the city council that the city of Lynn be authorized to dredge and maintain a certain channel in Lynn Harbor. Harbors and Public Lands.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

An Act providing for the Improvement of Lynn Harbor
for Navigation and Commerce.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of further improving
2 Lynn harbor for navigation and commerce, the city
3 of Lynn may dredge and maintain a suitable chan-
4 nel, at a point in said harbor, one hundred feet or
5 more outside the harbor line established for said
6 harbor by chapter three hundred thirteen of the
7 acts of eighteen hundred sixty-seven, which chan-
8 nel shall be one hundred fifty feet in width, twenty-
9 two feet in depth, extending a distance of seventeen
10 hundred feet westerly from the inner end of the
11 proposed federal improvement in Lynn harbor, and
12 may construct and maintain in Lynn harbor a berth
13 or berths with piers or other approaches thereto.
14 The location of such proposed channel shall be ap-
15 proved by the division of waterways and public
16 lands of the department of public works and shall

17 extend a distance of seventeen hundred feet westerly
18 from the inner end of the proposed federal improve-
19 ment in Lynn harbor, and the construction and
20 maintenance of said berth, berths, piers or other
21 berth approaches shall be in accordance with the
22 provisions of chapter ninety-one of the General Laws.
23 The said city is further authorized and directed to
24 deposit behind the bulkhead in said harbor, con-
25 structed under the provisions of chapter two hundred
26 sixty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and
27 twenty-seven, the material so dredged, and the said
28 city shall cover said material with gravel or other
29 suitable material.

1 SECTION 2. For the purpose of this act the said
2 city may borrow from time to time, within a period
3 of five years from the effective date of this act, such
4 sums as may be necessary, not exceeding in the aggre-
5 gate, three hundred thousand dollars and may issue
6 bonds and notes therefor, which shall bear on their
7 face the words, "Lynn Harbor Improvement for
8 Navigation and Commerce, Act of 1931." Each
9 authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan,
10 and such loans shall be paid in not more than ten
11 years from their dates. Indebtedness incurred under
12 this act shall be within the statutory limit and shall,
13 except as herein provided, be subject to chapter
14 forty-four of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 acceptance by vote of city council of said city, sub-
3 ject to the provisions of its charter; provided that
4 such acceptance occurs on or before the thirtieth
5 day of September in the current year.
