An Act relative to the Admissibility of Pleadings as Evidence in Certain Civil Actions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter two hundred and thirty-one of the Gen-
2 eral Laws is hereby amended by striking out section
3 eighty-seven and inserting in place thereof the fol-
4 lowing section: —

5 *Section 87.* Pleadings and allegations contained
6 therein shall not be evidence in any trial, except
7 that the allegations in the pleadings of the action
8 on trial shall bind the party making them.
