By Mr. Sawyer of Ware, petition of Roland D. Sawyer that the reconstructed Boston and Worcester Turnpike be suitably marked as a memorial to the valor and heroism of Massachusetts soldiers and sailors in the World War. Ways and Means (Joint).

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

Resolve to provide for Making the New Turnpike Highway between Boston and Worcester a Memorial to the Valor and Heroism and Achievements of Massachusetts Soldiers, Sailors and Marines in the World War.

1 *Resolved*, That there shall be allowed from the
2 treasury of the commonwealth the sum of
3 dollars, with which the public works department
4 and the department of conservation, shall cause to
5 be erected tablets and markers, and the setting out
6 of trees, and any other improvements deemed wise,
7 along the highway now in process of construction
8 between Boston and Worcester, to give such high-
9 way the character of a memorial to the valor and
10 heroism and achievements of the soldiers, sailors and
11 marines from Massachusetts in the world war,
12 and the designation of such highway in appropriate

13 manner as Victory drive or Memorial drive, or any
14 other suitable name in keeping with its character as
15 a memorial to the men in arms who aided in bringing
16 victory to the American expeditionary forces in
17 Europe.
