

HOUSE No. 959

By Mr. Duncan of Woburn, petition of Stephen S. Bean for an amendment of the law relative to the powers of insurance companies to insure against loss caused by rolling stock of railways. Insurance.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

An Act relating to the Powers of Insurance Companies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph sixth of section forty-seven of chapter
2 one hundred and seventy-five of the General Laws
3 is hereby amended by removing from the fourth line
4 of said section the words "except when caused by
5 the rolling stock of railways" so that said para-
6 graph as amended shall read as follows:—*Sixth,*
7 To insure (a) any person against bodily injury or
8 death by accident, or (b) any person against legal
9 liability for loss or damage on account of the bodily
10 injury or death of any person or on account of any
11 damage to property of another, or (c) against loss
12 or damage to, or loss of use of, motor vehicles except
13 motor boats, airplanes, seaplanes, dirigibles or other
14 aircraft, their fittings and contents, whether such
15 vehicles or aircraft are being operated or not, and

16 wherever the same may be, resulting from collision
 17 or accident, except loss or damage by fire or light-
 18 ning or while being transported in any conveyance
 19 by land or water; (d) to make insurance upon the
 20 health of individuals; or (e) to insure the payment
 21 of workmen's compensation benefits under chapter
 22 one hundred and fifty-two.
