## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

An Act relative to Maximum Salaries for Positions or Offices in the Commonwealth Classified under Junior Grade.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section forty-five of chapter thirty of the Gen-  
2 eral Laws, as most recently amended by section six  
3 of chapter four hundred of the acts of nineteen  
4 hundred and thirty, is hereby further amended by  
5 inserting after the word "position" in the tenth  
6 line, as printed in said section six, the following:  
7 — ; provided, that in said classification, the maxi-  
8 mum salaries for positions or offices in the junior  
9 grade shall be not less than fifteen hundred dol-  
10 lars, — so that the first sentence of said section  
11 forty-five, as so printed, will read as follows: —  
12 *Section 45.* All appointive offices and positions in  
13 the government of the commonwealth, except those  
14 in the judicial branch and those in the legislative

15 branch other than the additional clerical and other  
16 assistants in the sergeant-at-arms' office, but in-  
17 cluding registers and assistant registers of probate  
18 and their assistants, shall be classified by the divi-  
19 sion of personnel and standardization, subject to the  
20 approval of the governor and council, in services,  
21 groups and grades according to the duties pertain-  
22 ing to each office or position; provided, that in said  
23 classification, the maximum salaries for positions or  
24 offices in the junior grade shall be not less than  
25 fifteen hundred dollars.
