
By Mr. Murphy of Boston, petition of John F. Murphy and Leo M. Birmingham for the appointment of a special commission (including members of the General Court) to investigate the advisability of the Commonwealth providing home aid for war veterans. Rules (Joint).

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

Resolve providing for an Investigation by a Special Commission relative to the Advisability of providing Home Aid for War Veterans.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission to
2 consist of one member of the senate to be designated
3 by the president thereof, three members of the house
4 of representatives to be designated by the speaker
5 thereof, and three persons to be appointed by the
6 governor shall make an investigation relative to the
7 advisability of the commonwealth providing for home
8 aid for war veterans. Said commission in the course
9 of its investigation shall consider the provisions of
10 legislation enacted by the state of California pro-
11 viding for such aid. Said commission may expend,
12 after an appropriation has been made, for clerical and
13 other services and expenses, such sums, not exceed-
14 ing dollars, as may be approved by the
15 governor and council. Said commission shall report
16 to the general court the result of its investigation and
17 its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of
18 legislation necessary to carry its recommendations
19 into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the
20 house of representatives not later than December
21 first in the current year.
