Resolve providing for the Representation of the Commonwealth at the Yorktown Sesquicentennial Celebration at Yorktown, Virginia, in the Current Year.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to
2 consist of such members as may be appointed by
3 the governor, is hereby authorized to represent the
4 commonwealth at the sesquicentennial celebration
5 of the surrender of the British army under Corn-
6 wallis to the American army under Washington, to
7 be held at Yorktown, Virginia, in October of the cur-
8 rent year. For the purposes of this resolve, said com-
9 mission may expend, with the approval of the governor
10 and council, such sums, not exceeding twenty-five
11 hundred dollars, as may hereafter be appropriated.
