To accompany the petition of George C. McMenimen and Harry C. Mohr for legislation to give preference to certain former employees in the labor service of the city of Cambridge for re-employment therein. Civil Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

An Act giving Preference to Certain Former Employees in the Labor Service of the City of Cambridge for Re-employment therein.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Maurice J. O'Connor, Harry T.
2 O'Connor, Oscar J. McLean, John L. Havey, Stephen
3 C. Harrigan, Francis T. Gurry, John F. Grady, John
4 J. Conroy, Daniel F. Short, Hugh J. O'Neil and
5 Timothy Scully, former employees in the labor service
6 of the city of Cambridge, who were removed therefrom
7 in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-eight by
8 order of the division of civil service, by reason of the
9 fact that certain classification requirements under the
10 civil service law were not complied with, shall, if duly
11 registered as applicants for employment in the labor
12 service of said city, be given preference for re-employ-
13 ment therein.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
