

HOUSE No. 941

By Mr. Ingalls of Lynn (by request), petition of John J. Butler that clerical employees of registries of deeds and registries of probate be placed under civil service laws. Civil Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Two.

An Act making Clerical Employees of Registries of Deeds and Registries of Probate of All Counties amenable to Civil Service Regulations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter one hundred and thirty of
2 the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-three is
3 hereby amended by striking out therefrom the clause
4 reading as follows: — “clerical employees in the reg-
5 istries of probate of all counties.”

1 SECTION 2. Section four of chapter thirty-one of
2 the General Laws of the commonwealth is hereby
3 amended by adding thereto the following para-
4 graph: —

5 Clerical employees of registries of deeds and regis-
6 tries of probate of all counties.

The Constitution of Connecticut

As the same stands after the amendments made in 1875, the Constitution of Connecticut is divided into three parts, to-wit: the Preamble, the Declaration of Rights, and the Declaration of the Principles of the Government.

The Preamble is contained in the first section of the first article, and the Declaration of Rights is contained in the first section of the second article, and the Declaration of the Principles of the Government is contained in the first section of the third article.
