
By Messrs. Murphy and Birmingham of Boston, petition of John F. Murphy and Leo M. Birmingham that the Metropolitan District Commission construct an underpass or overpass at the junction of Commonwealth Avenue and Essex Street in the city of Boston. Metropolitan Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Two.

An Act to provide for the Construction of an Underpass or Other Grade Separation at the Intersection of Commonwealth Avenue and Essex Street in the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby
2 ordered and directed to construct during the current
3 year a grade separation, circle, underpass or overpass
4 as recommended by the division of metropolitan
5 planning at the intersection of Commonwealth avenue
6 and Essex street in the city of Boston. Said com-
7 mission is authorized to expend a sum not exceeding
8 thousand dollars for the above purpose, one
9 third of which shall be paid by the city of Boston, one
10 third by the cities and towns of the metropolitan parks
11 district and one third from the Highway Fund. The
12 above cost shall be assessed in three annual payments,
13 one in each of the three years following the construc-
14 tion.

The House of Representatives of the State of New York, in session assembled, do hereby pass the following resolution:

The Administration of the State

Resolved, That the following be the policy of the State:

That the State shall be managed in a manner that shall be consistent with the best interests of the people of this State.

2. The State shall provide for the education of its citizens.
3. The State shall provide for the health and safety of its citizens.
4. The State shall provide for the economic well-being of its citizens.
5. The State shall provide for the cultural and recreational needs of its citizens.
6. The State shall provide for the housing needs of its citizens.
7. The State shall provide for the transportation needs of its citizens.
8. The State shall provide for the energy needs of its citizens.
9. The State shall provide for the environmental needs of its citizens.
10. The State shall provide for the social services needs of its citizens.
11. The State shall provide for the public safety needs of its citizens.
12. The State shall provide for the international relations needs of its citizens.
13. The State shall provide for the defense needs of its citizens.
14. The State shall provide for the foreign relations needs of its citizens.
15. The State shall provide for the diplomatic needs of its citizens.
