An Act Increasing the Cash Value of Full Maintenance under the State Retirement System and Extending the Maintenance Provisions of the Law to a Position in Any Division of the State Service.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section three, paragraph four, of chapter thirty-
2 two of the General Laws, as amended by section two
3 of chapter three hundred and forty-one of the acts of
4 nineteen hundred and twenty-two, is hereby amended
5 by striking out said paragraph and inserting in place
6 thereof the following new paragraph: —

7 (4) It shall determine the percentage of wages or
8 salary that employees shall contribute to the fund
9 subject to the minimum and maximum percentages,
10 and may classify employees for the purposes of the
11 system and establish different rates of contribution
12 for different classes within the prescribed limits. It
13 shall add to the cash payment for regular services, in
14 cases where an employee receives or is entitled to
15 receive a non-cash allowance to cover compensation
16 in the form of full or complete boarding and housing in
17 accordance with the practice in such state institution,
18 school or department, an amount at the rate of five

19 dollars per week, which amount added to said cash
20 payment shall be the basis upon which annuity con-
21 tributions shall be made; and the foregoing provision
22 shall also apply in computing pensions based upon
23 prior service.
