An Act authorizing the Town of Marblehead to pay an Annuity to the Widow of George P. Kelley.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a
2 moral obligation, the town of Marblehead may pay
3 to the widow of George P. Kelley, who died March
4 third, nineteen hundred and thirty-two, in conse-
5 quence of injuries sustained October twenty-
6 third, nineteen hundred and thirty, while in
7 the performance of his duties as a member of the
8 police department of said town, an annuity not
9 exceeding dollars, said annuity to terminate
10 upon her remarriage. Said annuity shall be paid
11 from the annual appropriation for the maintenance
12 of the police department of said town.

1 SECTION 2.- This act shall take effect upon its
2 acceptance during the current year by vote of the
3 board of selectmen of said town, but not otherwise.
