The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Three.

An Act to reduce the Number of the Membership of the Board of Aldermen in the City of Medford to Seven Aldermen to be Elected at Large.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The membership of the board of
2 aldermen of the city of Medford shall be reduced to
3 seven aldermen to be elected at large, one member to
4 be selected from each of the seven wards.

5 They shall hold office for a period of two years, and
6 shall be elected by the qualified voters of the entire
7 city.

8 They each shall receive a salary of nine hundred
9 dollars a year.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted to the
2 voters of the city of Medford at the annual election
3 in the current year. And if a majority of the voters
4 voting thereon shall vote in the affirmative, this act
5 shall thereupon take effect.
