## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Three.

Resolve providing Reimbursement for Persons who Suffered Property Damage from Acts of Violence against the Residence of Judge Webster Thayer of Worcester.

1 *Resolved*, That, for the purpose of discharging a  
2 moral obligation and also for the purpose of pro-  
3 moting the public good and after an appropriation  
4 has been made therefor, there be allowed and paid  
5 out of the treasury of the commonwealth, the sum  
6 of thirty thousand dollars, to provide for reimburse-  
7 ment to those persons living or owning property in  
8 the vicinity of the residence of Honorable Webster  
9 Thayer, justice of the superior court for the com-  
10 monwealth, at Worcester, in the commonwealth,  
11 who suffered loss or damage to their dwellings and  
12 property on account of the bombing of the residence  
13 of the said justice on September twenty-seventh,  
14 nineteen hundred and thirty-two, said persons and  
15 loss or damage to be determined, and said reim-

16 bursement to be made out of the sum so appro-  
 17 priated, under the direction of the governor and  
 18 council, upon such evidence and upon such vouchers  
 19 as they may require, any balance not so expended  
 20 to be returned to the treasury of the commonwealth.
