**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Three.

An Act regulating the Display of Red Lights on Motor Vehicles and requiring Certain Motor Vehicles to be equipped with Red Reflectors visible from the Rear.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section seven of chapter ninety of the General  
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section one of  
3 chapter one hundred and twenty-three of the acts of  
4 nineteen hundred and thirty-two, is hereby further  
5 amended by inserting after the word "number" in  
6 the fifty-second line the two following new sentences:  
7 — No motor vehicle so operated, except fire apparatus,  
8 shall display a red light in the direction toward which  
9 the vehicle is proceeding or facing. Every commercial  
10 motor vehicle or trailer having a carrying capacity of  
11 two tons or over shall, in addition to such rear light,  
12 be equipped with a red reflector, approved by the  
13 registrar, so located at the rear of such vehicle as to  
14 reflect rays of light thrown upon such reflector from  
15 behind.
