HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, March 15, 1933.

The committee on Metropolitan Affairs, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 440) of J. Walton Tuttle that residents of the town of Ashland be authorized to fish in basins two and four of the metropolitan water system under such regulations as may be made by the Metropolitan District Commission, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 441) of J. Walton Tuttle that use of Mill Pond or Lombard Pond in Ashland for boating, fishing and bathing be authorized under such regulations as may be made by the Metropolitan District Commission, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 442) of James E. Arnold and J. Walton Tuttle that fishing in Lake Cochituate by inhabitants of the towns of Framingham, Natick and Wayland be authorized under such regulations as may be made by the Metropolitan District Commission, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 767) of W. Goulding Warren and other members of the General Court that the Metropolitan District Commission be authorized to provide public bathing facilities in Holden, Rutland and Sterling, report the accompanying resolve (House, No. 1268).

Resolve providing for an Investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission and the Department of Public Health of the Advisability of allowing Boating and Fishing and Other Forms of Recreation within the Watersheds of the Metropolitan Water District.

1 *Resolved*, That the metropolitan district commis-
2 sion and the department of public health, acting as
3 a joint board, are hereby authorized and directed to
4 investigate the advisability of allowing boating and
5 fishing and other forms of recreation within the
6 watersheds of the sources of water supply of the
7 metropolitan water district. The said board shall
8 also consider and report as to the extent to which
9 boating and fishing and other forms of recreation,
10 if any, are now or may be authorized within said
11 watersheds. Said board or its authorized employees
12 may enter the premises of any person or corporation
13 for the purposes of this resolve.

14 Said board shall report to the general court the
15 results of its investigation and its recommendations,
16 if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary
17 to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing
18 the same with the clerk of the house of representa-
19 tives on or before the first Wednesday in December
20 in the current year.
