The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Three.

An Act providing for the Improvement for Park and Beach Purposes of Certain Land owned by the Commonwealth adjoining Old Colony Parkway in the Dorchester District of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission
2 is hereby authorized and directed to improve for
3 park purposes the land owned by the commonwealth
4 and located on the easterly and westerly sides of
5 Old Colony parkway between Savin Hill and Free-
6 port street in the Dorchester district of the city of
7 Boston, by grading, loaming, seeding and planting
8 said land and by doing all such other work thereon as
9 the commission deems desirable, and to construct a
10 beach and public bath house on that portion of said
11 land as is located on said easterly side of said parkway
12 and adjoins Dorchester bay.

1 SECTION 2. For the purpose of carrying out the
2 work authorized by this act, the commission may
3 expend such sums, not exceeding in the aggregate,
4 one hundred thousand dollars, as may hereafter be
5 appropriated, the same to be paid by the cities and

6 towns of the metropolitan parks district in proportion
7 to the respective taxable valuations of the property
8 of said cities and towns as defined in section fifty-nine
9 of chapter ninety-two of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
