An Act relative to the Establishment of Automobile Parking Areas in Connection with the Proposed State Reservation at Salisbury Beach.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section two of chapter four hundred  
2 and forty-two of the acts of nineteen hundred and  
3 thirty-one, as amended by chapter sixty-two of the  
4 acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-two, is hereby  
5 further amended by striking out the paragraphs con-  
6 tained in lines twenty to thirty-six, inclusive, as  
7 printed in said section two, and inserting in place  
8 thereof the following:—

9 (c) Unnamed street south of Thirteenth street from  
10 easterly location line of state highway to the land  
11 described in said paragraph I.

12 (d) Unnamed street south of Brookline street from  
13 easterly location line of state highway to the land  
14 described in said paragraph I.

15 III. As areas for automobile parking:—

16 A parcel or parcels of land in that part of Salisbury,  
17 known as Salisbury beach, bounded on the east by  
18 the parcel of land described in paragraph I, on the  
19 south by the Merrimack river, on the west by a line

20 one mile west of the shore line of the Atlantic ocean  
21 and running parallel with said shore line, and on the  
22 north by the Massachusetts-New Hampshire bound-  
23 ary line.

24 All of the takings described in paragraphs I and II  
25 are shown on a plan entitled "Plan of Salisbury Beach  
26 and Environs prepared for the Salisbury Beach and  
27 Duxbury Beach Reservations Commission by Morse  
28 & Dickinson, Engineers, 11 Beacon Street, Boston,  
29 Mass. 1928."

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of sec-  
2 tion fourteen of chapter twenty-nine of the General  
3 Laws, so much of the appropriation made by section  
4 two of said chapter four hundred and forty-two as  
5 may be necessary for the purposes of this act shall  
6 without further appropriation be available at any  
7 time up to and including June tenth, nineteen hun-  
8 dred and thirty-four.
