In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Three.

An Act providing for the Ultimate Abolition of All Non-Contributory Pension and Retirement Systems.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter thirty-two of the General Laws, as ap-
2 pearing in the Tercentenary edition thereof, is hereby
3 amended by adding thereto the following new sec-
4 tion: —

5 *Section 94.* The provisions of this chapter, in so
6 far as they provide for the payment of pensions or
7 retirement allowances without prior contributions by
8 the recipient thereof, shall apply only to persons in
9 the respective services to which the same are appli-
10 cable on the first day of January in the year nineteen
11 hundred and thirty-five and to persons already in
12 receipt of such a pension or retirement allowance.
