An Act relative to Apprentices and Assistants to Registered Embalmers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section eighty-seven of chapter one hundred and  
2 twelve of the General Laws, as appearing in the Ter-  
3 centenary edition thereof, is hereby amended by  
4 striking out the words "or assistants", in the eighth  
5 line thereof, and substituting in place thereof the  
6 words: — registered with the board, — so that said  
7 section shall read as follows: — *Section 87.* Whoever,  
8 not being registered under section eighty-two or cor-  
9 responding provisions of earlier laws, shall, by himself  
10 or by his agent or servant, unless such agent or serv-  
11 ant is so registered, engage in the business of em-  
12 balming human dead bodies shall, except as provided  
13 in section sixty-five, be punished by a fine of not more  
14 than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not  
15 more than two months, or both; but sections eighty-  
16 two to eighty-seven, inclusive, shall not prohibit the  
17 employment of apprentices registered with the board  
18 under the personal supervision of a registered em-  
19 balmer.
