To accompany the petition of Patrick J. Foley that provision be made for the better lighting of the Woburn Parkway in the city of Woburn. Metropolitan Affairs.

An Act providing for the Better Lighting of the
Woburn Parkway in the City of Woburn.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby
2 authorized and directed to establish, and there-
3 after to maintain, as a part of the expense of
4 construction and maintenance of boulevards, an
5 efficient lighting system upon the Woburn park-
6 way, so called, in the city of Woburn along and
7 near the shores of Horn pond.

The Constitution of the State

Article I. Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

But no Representative shall hold Office longer than two Years; and no Person shall be Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years Residence in the United States; and, except as aforesaid, no Person shall be Representative who shall not, when elected, have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and who, when elected, shall not, when elected, have been born in the United States.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall hold Office until the next Meeting of the Legislature of the State in which he shall be chosen, but no Senator shall be chosen for a longer Term than two Years; and no Person shall be Senator who shall not, when elected, have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and who, when elected, shall not, when elected, have been born in the United States.
