The committee on Ways and Means, to whom was referred the House Resolves providing for an investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission relative to the advisability of widening, reconstructing and extending Woburn Parkway in the city of Woburn and relative to providing for the better lighting of said parkway (House, No. 2021); providing for an investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission and the Department of Public Works relative to the widening and reconstruction of a highway in Medford and Stoneham (House, No. 2106); providing for an investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission and the Department of Public Works relative to the laying out and construction of a boulevard in the city of Medford (House, No. 2108); providing for an investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission and the Department of Public Works relative to the construction of a bridge over the Charles River in the town of Watertown (House, No. 2109); providing for an investigation relative to the advisability of constructing certain beaches and the construction and maintenance of bath houses thereat and of providing certain other recreational facilities in certain municipalities in the Metropolitan Parks District (House, No. 2127); and providing for an investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission relative to the advisability of acquiring certain real estate on Endicott Avenue in the city of Revere for reservation purposes (House, No. 2168), report recommending that

the same ought to pass with an amendment substituting therefor a new draft entitled "Resolve providing for an investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission relative to certain ways, bridges, beaches and recreational facilities" (Senate, No. 554).

Resolve providing for an Investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission relative to Certain Ways, Bridges, Beaches and Recreational Facilities.

1 *Resolved*, That the metropolitan district commis-
2 sion is hereby authorized and directed to investigate
3 the subject matter of current house document num-
4 bered two thousand and twenty-one, relative to the
5 widening, reconstructing and extending, and the
6 better lighting, of Woburn parkway, in Woburn, of
7 current house document numbered twenty-one hun-
8 dred and six, relative to the widening and reconstruc-
9 tion of a certain highway in Medford and Stoneham,
10 of current house document numbered twenty-one
11 hundred and eight, relative to the laying out and
12 construction of a boulevard in said Medford, of cur-
13 rent house documents numbered seventeen hundred
14 and eighty-eight and twenty-one hundred and nine,
15 relative to the construction of a bridge over the
16 Charles river in Watertown, of current senate docu-
17 ments numbered twenty-three, one hundred and
18 thirty-nine, two hundred and seventy-five and two
19 hundred and seventy-nine and current house docu-
20 ments numbered six hundred and thirteen, eleven
21 hundred and forty-three, seventeen hundred and
22 eighteen, nineteen hundred and twenty, nineteen hun-
23 dred and forty-seven and twenty-one hundred and

24 twenty-seven, relative to the construction of certain
25 beaches and the construction and maintenance of
26 bath houses thereat and to providing certain other
27 recreational facilities on the shores of the Neponset
28 river in Boston and Milton, of the Charles river in
29 Waltham, Cambridge and Watertown, of the Mystic
30 river in Somerville and Arlington, of Dark Hollow
31 pond in Stoneham and of Houghton's pond in Milton,
32 and of current house document numbered twenty-one
33 hundred and sixty-eight, relative to the acquisition, for
34 reservation purposes, of all the real estate, not already
35 owned by the commonwealth, abutting on the easterly
36 side of a portion of Endicott avenue in Revere, and
37 the advisability, feasibility and probable cost of the
38 several projects therein referred to. Said commission
39 may expend for the purposes of this resolve such
40 sum, not exceeding twelve thousand dollars, as may
41 hereafter be appropriated therefor, and shall report
42 to the general court the results of its investigations
43 and its recommendations, including estimates of cost,
44 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry
45 said recommendations into effect, by filing the same
46 with the clerk of the senate on or before the first
47 Wednesday of December in the current year.
