**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

---

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Six.

---

An Act further defining and regulating the Power and Authority of Milk Inspectors and Their Compensation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section thirty-three of chapter ninety-  
2 four of the General Laws, as appearing in the Ter-  
3 centenary Edition, is hereby amended by inserting  
4 after the word "them" in line seven the following  
5 words:— unless such compensation is fixed by ordi-  
6 nance or otherwise.

1 SECTION 2. Section thirty-three of chapter ninety-  
2 four of the General Laws, as appearing in the Ter-  
3 centenary Edition, is hereby amended by adding, at  
4 the end of said section, the following sentence:—

5 Such inspectors so appointed shall have the same  
6 power and authority as is given or delegated to any  
7 other officer, agent or assistant of the same health  
8 department.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

Article I. The Legislative Department

Section 1. The legislative power shall be vested in a Senate and House of Representatives, who shall be styled the Senate and Representatives of the Commonwealth, styled the Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of six members, who shall be chosen by the electors of the Commonwealth, and shall hold their offices for two years, and until their successors be chosen.

Section 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen by the electors of the Commonwealth, and shall hold their offices for two years, and until their successors be chosen.
