Accompanying the second recommendation of the Auditor of the Commonwealth (House, No. 1). State Administration.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Seven.

An Act abolishing the Comptroller's Bureau and transferring the Powers and Duties thereof to the State Auditor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The comptroller's bureau is hereby abolished and
2 the powers and duties of said bureau are hereby
3 transferred to and shall hereafter be exercised and
4 performed by the state auditor. The permanent
5 clerical assistants now serving in the comptroller's
6 bureau are hereby transferred to the department of
7 the state auditor without impairment of their civil
8 service status.
