

By Mr. Johnson of Brockton, petition of Adolph Johnson that members of the Executive Council be made ineligible for appointment to certain offices and positions and that members of the General Court be prohibited from holding certain other salaried positions. State Administration.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Seven.

An Act rendering Members of the Executive Council Ineligible for Appointment to Certain Offices and Positions, and prohibiting Members of the General Court from Holding Certain Other Salaried Positions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter six of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by inserting after section three, as
3 appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, the following
4 new section:—

5 *Section 3A.* No member of the council shall, dur-
6 ing the term for which he was elected, be eligible for
7 appointment by the governor or any other state
8 officer to any office or position created by statute
9 whereof the salary is payable from the state treasury
10 or from the treasury of a county, city, town or district.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter three of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by inserting after section eleven,
3 as so appearing, the following new section:—

4 *Section 11A.* No member of the general court shall
5 hold any other office or position created by statute
6 whereof the salary is payable from the treasury of
7 the commonwealth or from the treasury of any
8 county thereof.
