The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Seven.

An Act relative to the Tenure of Office of Certain Officers
and Employees of the Town of Hull.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The members of the police and fire
2 forces, the public safety commissioner and the man-
3 ager and employees of the light department in the
4 town of Hull in office at the time this act takes effect
5 and any persons thereafter appointed to fill any vacan-
6 cies existing in said offices or positions shall hold the
7 same during good behavior and until removed there-
8 from in accordance with the provisions of the Gen-
9 eral Laws and rules and regulations made thereunder
10 relative to removals from the classified public service.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its ac-
2 ceptance by a majority of the registered voters of
3 said town voting thereon by official ballot at an an-
4 nual town meeting or at a special meeting called for
5 the purpose within three years from the passage of
6 this act.
