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Chap. 330. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF NEWTON TO LEASE ANY OF ITS MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS FOR A TERM OF YEARS NOT EXCEEDING SIXTY-FIVE YEARS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section three of chapter forty of the General Laws or any other law to the contrary, the city of Newton is hereby authorized to lease any and all of its municipal buildings for a term of years not exceeding sixty-five years.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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Chap. 331. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF CONCORD TO LEASE SURPLUS LAND AND BUILDINGS FOR PERIODS UP TO FORTY YEARS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The town of Concord, acting by its board of selectmen and upon a vote of an annual or special town meeting, is hereby authorized to lease public lands and buildings and parts thereof which are declared to be surplus for a period of up to forty years. Schoolhouses in actual use as such are excepted.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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Chap. 332. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF SHERBORN TO BORROW MONEY TO PROVIDE PROGRAMS FOR CERTAIN ELDERLY PERSONS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The town of Sherborn is hereby authorized to appropriate money and receive gifts and grants to construct, equip, furnish, rent, manage and maintain housing, for elderly persons of the commonwealth of low and moderate income or who
