AN ACT ESTABLISHING AN AUXILIARY BOARD OF ARBITRATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter twenty-three of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended, is hereby further amended by the
3 addition of the following new section:—

4 *Section 7A.* In addition to the board of concilia-
5 tion and arbitration there is hereby established, for
6 a period of three years, or for such longer period as
7 may be determined by the governor, with the advice
8 and consent of the council, an auxiliary board of arbi-
9 tration consisting of three members, one of whom
10 shall represent the public, who shall be chairman, one
11 of whom shall be a representative of labor, and one,
12 a representative of employers of labor. Said mem-
13 bers shall be appointed by the governor, with the
14 advice and consent of the council, for a term of three
15 years. This auxiliary board of arbitration shall have

16 all the authority contained in section five and section
17 six of chapter one hundred and fifty of the General
18 Laws in all matters which are assigned to it by the
19 chairman of the board of conciliation and arbitration.
20 Each member shall receive such salary, not exceeding
21 five thousand dollars per annum, as the governor and
22 council shall determine.
