**Chap. 366. AN ACT EXEMPTING THE POSITIONS OF SEALER OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES, PLUMBING INSPECTOR AND ALTERNATE PLUMBING INSPECTOR IN THE TOWN OF SOMERSET FROM THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.**

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The positions of sealer of weights and measures, plumbing inspector and alternate plumbing inspector in the town of Somerset shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. The provisions of section one shall not impair the civil service status of any person holding the positions of sealer of weights and measures, plumbing inspector or alternate plumbing inspector in the town of Somerset on the effective date of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**Chap. 367. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE HEALTH FACILITIES APPEALS BOARD.**

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 166 of chapter 6 of the General Laws, inserted by section 1 of chapter 776 of the acts of 1972, is hereby amended by inserting after the second sentence the following sentence:- The legal representation of the personal interests of an individual engaged in health care shall not, for the purposes of this section, constitute a fiduciary relationship.

SECTION 2. The second paragraph of section 25E of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 3 of said chapter 776, is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:- Failure of the board to issue a final decision within one hundred and twenty days after filing of the appeal shall constitute a final decision affirming the action of the department and denying the appeal.

**QUIREMENTS FOR THE WORLD WAR II SCHOLARSHIP FUND OF THE TOWN OF MANSFIELD.**

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 50 of the acts of 1952 is hereby amended by striking out section 1 and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

Section 1. The town of Mansfield is hereby authorized to raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand dollars to provide a scholarship fund the income of which may be used for the higher education of all high school graduates who live in said town, and said fund shall be dedicated as a memorial to veterans of World War II.

**Chap. 369. AN ACT DIRECTING BARNSTABLE COUNTY TO PAY CERTAIN RETIREMENT BENEFITS TO THE SURVIVING SPOUSE OF HERMAN RAINS.**

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, for the purpose of promoting the public good, the retirement board of Barnstable county is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Dorothy Rains, the surviving spouse of Herman Rains, a former employee of the Barnstable school department, whose death occurred after the date of his retirement, the disability retirement benefits payable, under the provisions of option (c), of subdivision (2) of section twelve of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws to survivors of members of a retirement system established under said chapter thirty-two.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of January ninth, nineteen hundred and eighty-one.

**Chap. 370. AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN POSITIONS IN THE TOWN OF BELMONT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.**
