special or general law to the contrary, the positions of assistant superintendent of highways and highway and incinerator foreman in the highway department of the town of Belmont shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 3. The provisions of sections one and two of this act shall not impair the civil service status of any person holding the positions of assistant superintendent of highways and highway and incinerator foreman in the highway department in the town of Belmont on the effective date of this act.

Chap. 371. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ADJUSTMENT OF THE CIVIL SERVICE SENIORITY DATE OF ARTHUR C. CADEGAN, JR.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the length of service of Arthur C. Cadegan, Jr., a captain in the police department of the city of Boston, shall, for purposes of computing seniority under the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws, include the period from January second, nineteen hundred and seventy-five to January first, nineteen hundred and seventy-nine, inclusive, and shall also include seniority accrued up to January second, nineteen hundred and seventy-five.

Chap. 372. AN ACT PERMITTING MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATORS TO MAKE CERTAIN TURNS ON RED LIGHTS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 8 of chapter 89 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the second paragraph, as most recently amended by chapter 43 of the acts of 1981, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-

At any intersection on ways, as defined in section one of chapter ninety, in which vehicular traffic is facing a steady red indication in a traffic control signal, the driver of a vehicle which is stopped as close as practicable at the entrance to the
