RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING CONGRESS TO ENACT LEGISLATION AMENDING THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT SO THAT FEDERAL FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION THEREUNDER MAY BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE STATES WHICH HAVE ABOLISHED THEIR SETTLEMENT OR RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS, ON A GRANT-IN-AID BASIS, FOR PURPOSES OF GENERAL RELIEF.

- 1 *Resolved*, That the General Court of Massachusetts  
2 hereby urges the Congress of the United States to  
3 amend the Social Security Act so that federal finan-  
4 cial participation thereunder may be made available  
5 to the States which have abolished their settlement  
6 or residence requirements, on a grant-in-aid basis,  
7 for purposes of general relief; and be it further  
8 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be sent  
9 forthwith by the secretary of the Commonwealth to  
10 the president of the United States, to the presiding  
11 officer of each branch of Congress and to the members  
12 thereof from this Commonwealth.
