AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARY OF THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section two of chapter twenty-two of the General
2 Laws, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is
3 hereby amended by striking out, in the fourth line,
4 the words "six thousand" and inserting in place
5 thereof the words:— seventy-five hundred, — so as
6 to read as follows:— *Section 2.* Upon the expira-
7 tion of the term of office of a commissioner, his suc-
8 cessor shall be appointed by the governor, with the
9 advice and consent of the council, for five years.
10 The commissioner shall receive such salary, not
11 exceeding seventy-five hundred dollars, as the gover-
12 nor and council determine.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

2. No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, seven Years shall have elapsed since the Migration of the People, and he shall, when elected, be seven Years in the Service of the United States.

3. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

4. No Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years in the Service of the United States.

5. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
