AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT TOWN CLERKS IN TOWNS OF OVER TEN THOUSAND INHABITANTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The last sentence of section nineteen of chapter  
2 forty-one of the General Laws, as most recently  
3 amended by chapter sixty-six of the acts of nineteen  
4 hundred and thirty-eight, is hereby further amended  
5 by inserting before the word "No", in the first line  
6 the words:— In towns under ten thousand inhabit-  
7 ants, — so as to read as follows:— In towns under  
8 ten thousand inhabitants no person appointed as  
9 assistant clerk shall receive any salary for services as  
10 such from the town, but his compensation, if any,  
11 for such services shall be paid by the clerk, to whom  
12 all fees received by the assistant shall be paid.
