AN ACT TEMPORARILY ABOLISHING THE STATE RACING COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The state racing commission shall cease to function
2 during the continuation of the existing state of war
3 between the United States and any foreign country,
4 or until such time as the ban on horse and dog racing
5 in this commonwealth is discontinued by the federal
6 government. All persons now employed by the state
7 racing commission holding civil service tenure shall
8 be transferred to other positions in the service of the
9 commonwealth designated by the director of the divi-
10 sion of personnel and standardization, without im-
11 pairment of their civil service status.
