AN ACT ENABLING CERTAIN OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF BOSTON AND THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK TO PARTICIPATE IN THE BENEFITS OF AN EMERGENCY COMPENSATION ALLOTMENT PLAN, SO CALLED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 During the fiscal year of the city of Boston, begin-
2 ning January first, nineteen hundred and forty-five,
3 and continuing until the termination of the existing
4 war, an emergency compensation allotment may be
5 allowed and paid from the treasury of said city to
6 any official or employee of the city of Boston or of
7 the county of Suffolk whose salary is paid in whole
8 or in part from the treasury of said city, notwith-
9 standing any provisions of general or special law
10 which determine or limit the salary of such official
11 or employee. The amount of such allotment shall
12 be an amount equal to fifteen per cent of the salary
13 of each such official or employee, but said amount
14 shall not for full-time service be less than two hundred
15 and forty dollars nor more than three hundred and
16 sixty dollars.
