## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Five.

AN ACT INCREASING THE HOURLY RATE OF WAGES TO BE PAID TO EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR WORK PERFORMED DURING CERTAIN HOURS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter one hundred and forty-nine of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section  
3 twenty-seven E, inserted by chapter sixty-seven of the  
4 acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, the following  
5 new section:—

6 *Section 27F.* The wages of employees of the  
7 commonwealth, or of any political subdivision thereof,  
8 for work performed between the hours of six o'clock  
9 post meridian and eight o'clock ante meridian, shall  
10 be the regular rate plus six cents per hour.
