AN ACT VALIDATING A CERTAIN SPECIAL TOWN MEETING  
OF THE TOWN OF HOPKINTON HELD IN THE CURRENT  
YEAR.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The acts and proceedings of the town  
2 of Hopkinton at a special town meeting held on  
3 February twelfth in the current year, and all acts done  
4 in pursuance thereof, are hereby confirmed and made  
5 valid, to the same extent as if the said meeting had  
6 been called, held and conducted in strict compliance  
7 with law.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 2. No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, seven Years shall have elapsed since the Birth of such Person, and when elected he shall have seven Years Residence within that State.

Section 3. Representatives and Electors may be removed by Expulsion from the House of Representatives.
