AN ACT PLACING CERTAIN POSITIONS IN THE REGISTRY OF MOTOR VEHICLES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS IN THE OFFICIAL SERVICE CLASSIFICATION OF CIVIL SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The positions of storeroom helpers in the registry
2 of motor vehicles of the department of public works
3 shall, upon the effective date of this act, be placed in
4 the official service classification of civil service. The
5 persons employed in such positions on said effective
6 date and having a permanent or a permanent re-
7 current status under the civil service laws shall con-
8 tinue to serve in such positions and their tenure of
9 office shall be unlimited, subject, however, to the civil
10 service laws, and subject to their passing a non-
11 competitive qualifying examination to be given by
12 the division of civil service. Persons who do not
13 pass such an examination shall continue to be em-
14 ployed in their present positions, but shall not be
15 subject to said laws so far as they apply to said official
16 service.
