Crafts that there be paid a sum of money from the treasury of the Commonwealth to Allan A. Gillis for materials and work per-

formed at the State Infirmary at Tewksbury, and the petition (accompanied by resolve, House, No. 1508) of Joseph P. Ferriter that there be paid a sum of money from the treasury of the Commonwealth to William M. O'Donnell of Westfield for work done and materials furnished at the State Teachers' College in Westfield, Report the accompanying resolve (House, No. 2111).

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Five.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY AN UNPAID SPECIAL COMMISSION OF CERTAIN CLAIMS AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH BY CERTAIN PERSONS AND CORPORATIONS FOR WORK PERFORMED AND MATERIALS FURNISHED BY THEM.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to  
2 consist of one member of the senate to be designated  
3 by the president thereof, three members of the house  
4 of representatives to be designated by the speaker  
5 thereof and one person to be appointed by the gover-  
6 nor, is hereby established for the purpose of investi-  
7 gating the subject matter of current senate document  
8 numbered four hundred and fifteen and of current  
9 house documents numbered six hundred and seventeen,  
10 eight hundred and eighty-five, eight hundred and  
11 eighty-six, eight hundred and eighty-seven, eight  
12 hundred and eighty-eight and fifteen hundred and  
13 eight, relating to certain claims against the common-  
14 wealth by certain persons and corporations for work  
15 performed and materials furnished by them. Said  
16 commission may expend for clerical and other serv-  
17 ices and expenses, such sums, not exceeding, in the  
18 aggregate, one thousand dollars, as may hereafter  
19 be appropriated therefor. Said commission shall  
20 report to the general court the results of its investi-

21 gation, and its recommendations, if any, together with  
22 drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommenda-  
23 tions into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of  
24 the house of representatives on or before the first  
25 Wednesday of December in the current year.
