The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Five.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE HOSPITALIZATION AND TREATMENT FOR CERTAIN PERSONS WHO ARE ELIGIBLE FOR ADMISSION TO THE SOLDIERS' HOME IN MASSACHUSETTS, BUT CANNOT BE ACCOMMODATED THEREAT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any person who is eligible for admission to, and
2 treatment at, the Soldiers' Home in Massachusetts
3 may, with the approval of the commissioner of veter-
4 ans' services and at the expense of the commonwealth,
5 be hospitalized and treated at any public hospital,
6 if there are not sufficient facilities at said home to care
7 for such person.
